

AN URGENT NOTE from Rev. Paul T. Stallsworth

After every election, it is vital to be reminded that Jesus Christ is Lord. Not the Republican Party. And not the Democratic Party.

That is why we "[r]ender...to God the things that are God's." (Matthew 22) How do we do this? First of all, by confessing that Jesus Christ is the Lord, the Son of God who has come in the flesh. That means that Jesus Christ is the Lord of all history, all humanity, each and every human person.

Your gifts to Lifewatch help support our efforts, within The United Methodist Church, to witness to Christ's Lordship over all human lives, especially the very least of these. For Lifewatch, abortion is not a sidebar, not one issue among many issues. For Lifewatch, witnessing to the Christian truth about abortion is essential to our mission and foundational to our ministry.

Back in 1987, an explicit defense of unborn human life was rare in The United Methodist Church. Historic ministries to "unwed mothers" were obscured by political correctness. Not a single bishop publicly defended the sanctity of unborn human life. The Religious Coalition for Abortion Rights (now named the Religious Coalition for Reproductive Choice) was located in The United Methodist Building in Washington, DC. The Book of Discipline approved the use of abortion basically without exception. Abortion was usually a non-issue at General Conference and at Annual Conferences.

But the truth of the Lordship of Jesus Christ over all human life could not be repressed for long. Lifewatch was formed in 1987 by concerned clergy and laity who, like you, acknowledge Christ as the Lord of all human life.

Since 1987, bishops have begun defending the sanctity of human life. Seminary professors are teaching the sanctity of human life. Conference delegates are proposing this sanctity. Pastors are preaching this sanctity. Laity are ministering according to this sanctity.

Without your generous contributions and support, these advances would not have happened. Because of your generous

contributions and support, you have made Lifewatch's mission and ministry possible.

Our budget has always been minimal. In fact, it takes only <u>100</u> people giving an average of \$30/month to keep our witness going.
